**25** They arrived **JUST IN TIME FOR (JUST IN TIME TO TAKE)** their flight.

(4 or 5 words)

'Just in time' is an 'old favourite' in the FCE exam!

Just in time + to + verb just in time + for + noun.

**26** With time you **GET USED TO LIVING** in a foreign country.

GET USED TO + VERB WITH 'ING' = become used to doing something

27 If they HAD GOT UP EARLY they wouldn't have missed their flight.

Learn the 3<sup>rd</sup> conditional. It's very common in this part of the exam.

28 The other driver said the accident WAS MY FAULT.

Here you have to convert the sentence from 'blame' to 'fault'.

**29** We **SHOULD NOT HAVE GONE / OUGHT NOT TO HAVE GONE** to that awful restaurant last night. (4/5 words)

Should [not] have + Participle

**30** Our working lives **ARE BEING CHANGED BY** personal computers.
